

Central and Western Provincial Differences

Saskatchewan

- All prescriptions must pass through a provincial bill code of **SK** for Saskatchewan Health
- Options for SK drug plan: Adjudicate, Capture or Do Not Transmit
- If patient has **IA** (Indian Affairs) the SK bill code must be set to **Capture**
- SK bill code should be set to **Do Not Transmit** when the patient is out of province
- When **Capture** is selected for SK the next bill code will price the prescription

Alberta

- Provincial bill code is **AB** (Alberta Blue Cross)
- **Netcare** - Alberta's EHR (Electronic Health Record) Portal
- **AADL** (Alberta Aids to Daily Living) - Program helps Albertans with a long-term disability or illness maintain their independence by providing financial assistance to buy medical equipment and supplies
- Pricing - only use the **Pricing** tab for mixing per minute. All other pricing rules including Fee and Markup are set up in the **Var. Pricing** tab.

Ontario

- Provincial bill code is **DB** (Ontario Drug Benefits)
- **NMS** (Narcotic Monitoring Service) - Pharmacies are required to submit dispensing information about all monitored drugs to NMS

Manitoba

- All prescriptions must pass through a provincial bill code of **DP** (Pharmacare)
- In order for DP to capture the claim, use a **DU** intervention code
- All drugs are in **units**

British Columbia

- All prescriptions must pass through a provincial bill code of **PC** Pharmacare
- **Pharmanet** is the network that links information for eHealth
- **TAC/TDU** screens appear when submitting claims to Pharmacare
